Securing Corporate Sponsorships

The majority of Tuck DBP participants find funding for part or all of their program fees through leveraging their professional networks to gain corporate sponsors. The following section provides resources to help diverse business owners and executives secure sponsorship.

Who to Approach?

Past Tuck DBP participants have found funding from a variety of sources who are invested in the success of their businesses, including:

- Certifying organizations (e.g. NMSDC, WBENC, NGLCC)
- Local and regional Minority Supplier Diversity Councils and chambers of commerce
- Corporations that the participant's company supplies
- Corporations with a special interest in the participant's city or region
- Mentors, community members, and others in the participant's network

Benefits to the Sponsor:
